



GRAVIT8 and PROBLEM PITCHES

By now you'll have received your invitation to join Gravit8, our online Code Hack community! Look for this invitation in your email inbox.

The first thing you'll need to do is log in and set up an account with your unique code. Then, upload your problem pitch, view other pitches, cast your votes, and get to know your fellow hackers.

Selecting Problems for Our Hackathon

We're going to hack 15 healthcare problems together, selected through two different mechanisms. The top eight up-voted problems as voted by our Code Hack community are guaranteed a spot in the Problem Pitch session on Saturday, March 9. Keep check-

ing Gravit8 over the next week to see which problems are rising to the top! The remaining seven problems will be chosen wild-card style during the Problem Pitch session.

Everyone should come prepared to pitch! If your problem is selected, you get 30 seconds to convince other hackers to join your team.

Your Problem Pitch

We expect each hacker to post a pitch problem on the Gravit8 platform. Your problem pitch is your way of getting into the game. It can be a problem you encounter in your own work or life experience, something your team is tackling, or something you've observed about the healthcare system.

There's no perfect problem and no need to jump to solutions. Every pitch is worth so don't worry about not having a *good enough*

pitch. We encourage you to be creative with your pitch. Sell it! Let Code Hackers know why this is the problem we should be hacking together!

Remember that not everyone at Code Hack comes to this work from the same perspective so give us background information, any research or knowledge you have, your personal story of the problem, and any other compelling details.

Voting

Gravit8 gives you **three (3) votes** that you can use to up-vote your favourite problem pitches. Browse through the problem pitches, ask questions, leave comments, and get a sense of the problems out there in our Code Hack community. You also have the unlimited ability to like other pitches. When you're ready, cast your votes! **Voting closes at midnight on Friday, March 8.**

Build Your Code Hack Community

Gravit8 allows you to vote, comment, like, and interact with our community of innovators. Take advantage by reaching out to folks, chatting about your problem pitches, and getting to know each other before we meet face to face at Code Hack. We can't wait to see what you come up with!

Have fun! Code Hack begins here and it's going to be an exciting ride.

Activities

Registration starts again at **08:00** for those unable to attend the Friday evening session.

At 09:00, the **Problem Pitch session** begins. The top eight up-voted problems will pitch first. Then the seven wild-card pitches will happen. You may be called up to pitch wild-card style. **Pitchers will have 30 seconds for their pitch.** At the end of the problem pitch

session, we'll review the problem pitches together so that everyone is clear on the problems we'll be hacking.

When pitching ends, we'll start **Rapid Team Formation**. We'll ask our problem pitchers to stand around the room. The remaining participants will be asked to **wear your Code Hack t-shirt** if you aren't already wearing it and go stand with the problem you're most interested in hacking. You'll have five minutes to choose your problem.

It's important that all teams have representatives from all of our hacker categories: Patient, Care Provider, Builder, or Designer. Each category is represented by a different colour t-shirt. Once everyone has chosen a problem, we'll see if each team has a good distribution of roles. If not, we may ask you to join another team.

Logistics

Parking is available free of cost. Use the parking map in this package to find your spot.

Registration is required! Come sign in, complete the Participant Agreement, and get your t-shirt. You'll also be given access to our virtual resources so bring your smart phone.

Coffee, tea, and muffins will be available. If you're a hungry hacker, pack some snacks..

Be flexible. Your problem may not be chosen as one of the problems we'll hack together and you may not end up on your preferred hack team. Code Hack is about the experience of working together in new and innovative ways to solve healthcare challenges. Every problem is a hackable problem and every team is an excellent team!

Your Job

Hack, hack, hack! Take care of yourself and each other. And have fun!

Activities

This is your 24 hour design sprint! You'll gather your team, prototype a solution, and prepare to pitch your solution to the judges. There are a wide range of resources available to you during Code Hack.

Spaces: your hacker team will have a dedicated hacking space in the Woodward Room with a table, chairs, and power supply. Your

hacker space will be assigned to your team after Rapid Team Formation. **You'll also have access to break out spaces for times when your team needs private workspace.**

Laptops: please **bring your own laptop and smartphone** to Code Hack.

Resource Hub: come find your Code Hack support team in **Begbie 151**. We can help with questions, ideation materials, concerns, ideas, troubleshooting, and dance breaks.

Prototyping materials and 3D printer: You have access to a wide range of materials and a 3D printer. You'll find these resources in **Begbie 151**. Let us know if you're missing something you need. **You can access to a maximum of \$50 to purchase additional supplies.**

Slow Zone: From **1300 to 1700** in **S150**, join us in the Slow Zone for a break and mind re-set. Our fabulous yoga instructor will be on hand to offer **yoga classes**. We'll also have a **mindfulness coach** available to help you re-centre and energize. Code Hack is a sprint but can feel like a marathon. Use the Slow Zone to C.A.R.E. for you and your team.

Coaching: From **1300 to 1700**, you'll have access to three coaches. Each coach is

available for **15 minute sessions** with your team. Coaches provide you with an invaluable opportunity to test your solution with real-world experts. They'll also help you meet your awards criteria as part of stakeholder engagement. Coaching sessions are **available by sign up** only on a first come, first served basis. Sign up sheets are available at the Resource Hub in Begbie 151.

Your Coaches are:

Provider: A **Registered Nurse** will be available to you on **5SE of the PCC**. She can offer you **hands-on insight** into how your solution might function in a patient care environment and what kinds of considerations you might need to make from a care provider perspective.

Patient: A patient will be available to you on **5SE of the PCC**. They will offer you **hands-on insight** into how your solution impacts patients and what kinds of considerations you may need to make from a patient perspective.

Business Case: A business case coach will be available to you in 501 of the PCC. This coach can help you develop the business case for your solution, including feasibility, value, and ROI.

HACK, CONT'D!

Mentors: mentors will circulate from 13:00 to 17:00, offering insight, ideas, and real-world tips as you ideate and develop your solutions. No need to find them! They'll come to you in your hacking space.

Simulation Lab: The Royal Jubilee Hospital is home to the **Centre for Interprofessional Simulation Learning**. As a Code Hacker, you'll have access to this world-class resource. You can bring your solution in to the SIM Lab to practice how it might function on a patient, test it with existing equipment, practice a process or service design flow, or any other real-time application you can think of. **The SIM Lab is located in the Coronation Annex and drop-ins between 13:00 to 17:00 are welcome.**

Theatre: The theatre in the **Patient Care Centre 169** is available to teams for solution pitch

practice. You can access this resource via the sign up sheet on the door. ***It will be open from 13:00 Saturday to 09:00 Sunday.*** Use this space to get your solution pitch ready for the judges.

Logistics

Parking is available free of cost. Use the parking map in this package to find your spot.

Lunch and pizza dinner will be available on Saturday, March 9, in **\$150** in the Patient Care Centre. Lunch is at 12:00 and dinner is at 17:00. ***Gluten-free and vegetarian options will be available.***

You must submit your solution pitch presentation on the provided USB stick by 10:00 sharp.

No late presentations will be accommodated. Submit your pitch at the Resource Hub. Got your presentation in?

Great. Go eat some breakfast. You'll find it in S150. **Solution pitches start at 11:00.** There are two rounds, so please be back at the Woodward Room **by 10:45.**

Round 1: The Preliminaries

Two judging panels will run simultaneously for the preliminary round.

Teams will be divided into two groups: eight teams in one group, seven teams in the other. One judging panel will hear eight solution pitches. One panel will hear seven solution pitches. You'll be informed of where your preliminary pitch room is and what order you'll pitch in no later than 1045.

Each team has four minutes to pitch. The judges then have three minutes for questions. Timekeeping will be ruthless. No team will be allowed to exceed the time limit.

Each judging panel will select three teams to move on to the Finals for a total of **six finalist teams.**

Round 2: The Finals

The finals will take place in Woodward. All Code Hackers are asked to reassemble there for **12:00** sharp. If you're a finalist team, you'll be informed of the order you'll pitch in. If you're not a finalist, sit back and get ready to cheer your fellow hackers on.

Finalists have seven minutes to pitch. The judges then have eight minutes for questions.

Logistics

Use the Code Hack ***pitch deck template*** to organize your solution pitch. Review the ***Assessment Criteria*** to see what the judges are looking for. Be creative! Sell us on your solution!

There's no wrong way to pitch so go big!

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

All scores are on a 5 point scale. No decimals or half points will be given.

1 = Absent | **2** = Lacks key elements or insufficiently explored | **3** = Satisfactory | **4** = Above what is expected | **5** = Outstanding

1. Problem Understanding Is the health care need understood? Is the root cause identified? What current options available and what do they lack? How well do they understand their end user/customer?					
2. Value Proposition What is the potential impact of the solution? Is the value proposition well defined? Does the solution demonstrate an understanding of stakeholder needs?					
3. Innovation How innovative is the solution in relation to what already exists? Has the team identified the critical function that their solution provides and attempted (or planned) to prototype? If used, how innovative is the technology used?					
4. Feasibility How likely is the solution to be implemented? Are the necessary steps and challenges to implementation understood?					
5. Collaboration Is the team multi-disciplinary? Is the team's expertise on display in the solution? Has the team identified where additional expertise might enhance their solution?					
6. Presentation How polished and articulate is the presentation? Was the presentation within the time allotted? Did the presentation wow you?					
7. Problem Complexity How difficult is the problem being addressed? Try to differentiate between a flashy solution to an easy problem and a workable solution to a complex problem.					

CODE HACK PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

Vancouver Island Health Authority (“Island Health”) is pleased to host its premier health Hackathon, “Code Hack” on the campus of the Royal Jubilee Hospital on March 8, 9 and 10, 2019.

Code Hack is an opportunity to work creatively in teams on health care challenges and themes with the assistance of mentors from Island Health, academic institutions, as well as local companies and entrepreneurs. Participants will have the opportunity to create and submit works (each submitted work an “Entry”) that have the potential to provide solutions relevant to Island Health and the health care industry in general.

Code Hack is governed by this Island Health Participation Agreement (the “Agreement”). By participating in Code Hack, you (“you” or the “Participant”) agree to be bound by the terms of this Agreement, the decisions of Island Health (and its Code Hack judges) in relation to Code Hack, and all applicable laws.

1 PARTICIPATION

1.1 Eligibility:

Code Hack is open to all legal residents of Canada. Participants must sign this Agreement and those Participants not of legal age of majority in British Columbia (19 years) must also have this Agreement signed by a parent or legal guardian. Participants must not be subject to contractual limitations or employment conditions which restrict their ability to fully participate in this Code Hack or license the intellectual property rights in their Entry as contemplated in this Agreement.

Island Health reserves the right to require proof of identity and/or eligibility from Participants in a form acceptable to Island Health. Failure to provide such proof to the satisfaction of Island Health in a timely manner may result in disqualification.

1.2 Registration:

Applications for registration will be available on January 14 9:00 am PST until January 31 at 5:00 pm PST (the “Application Period”). Individuals who wish to participate must apply for Code Hack during the Application Period at www.islandhealth.ca/codehack. Island Health will send a confirmation email to each applicant.

Applicants will be notified during February 11, 2019 through February 22, 2018 if their application is successful. There is no registration fee for Code Hack.

Code Hack begins on Friday March 8, 2019 at 5:00 pm PST and ends on Sunday March 10, 2019 at 3:00 pm PST (the “Code Hack Period”), and will be held at Royal Jubilee Hospital Campus (1952 Bay Street, Victoria, BC).

Registered Participants must be present in person to

sign in to Code Hack no later than Saturday March 9, 2019 or they may be disqualified.

1.3 Expenses:

Participants are responsible for their own transportation to Code Hack venue and all other personal costs/expenses for the duration of Code Hack Period.

2 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

2.1 Intellectual Property Rights:

Intellectual property rights in each Entry will remain the property of the Participant(s) who create it, but Participants will license the Entry to Island Health on the terms set out below. Island Health accepts no responsibility for resolving intellectual property disputes among Participants.

Any intellectual property produced jointly may, subject to the agreement of the parties, be jointly owned and jointly copyrighted on terms acceptable to the parties. Joint ownership shall default to the following

formula unless otherwise agreed to by the Parties;

- a) 50% - Island Health;
- b) 50% - Participant(s)

2.2 Grant of License:

Any intellectual property arising from Code Hack conceived solely by the Participant shall be owned and managed by that Participant. That Participant shall grant to Island Health a non-exclusive, no-cost, royalty-free, transferable, sub-licensable, perpetual, irrevocable license (the "License") to use the intellectual property for their own internal research, clinical and educational non-commercial purposes. You agree to execute all further documents that Island Health deems necessary to perfect the License or confirm the intent of this Agreement. You agree that you will not, directly or indirectly, challenge the validity of the License or participate in or support any action that disputes Island Health's right to use the Entry in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

3 REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES, INDEMNITY, LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

3.1 Representations and Warranties:

You represent and warrant that: (a) you meet the eligibility requirements for Participants and will abide by the terms of this Agreement and the decisions of the judges, (b) your contribution to your Entry will be your own original work or that you have all necessary rights or licenses to incorporate any third party intellectual property into the Entry (including the right to license such rights to Island Health in accordance with the License), (c) your contribution to your Entry will not infringe the intellectual property rights or contractual rights of any third person, and (d) your Entry will fully comply with the terms of this Agreement.

3.2 Indemnity:

You agree to indemnify and hold harmless Island Health (including its directors, officers, employees, agents and independent contractors) against all actual or alleged claims, liabilities, costs and damages relating to: (a) any allegation that the Entry, or Island Health's use of the Entry, infringes any third

party proprietary right, (b) any dispute between you and another Participant, and (c) your breach of this Agreement.

3.3 Limitation of Liability:

In no event will Island Health be liable to you for any direct, indirect, special, incidental, punitive or consequential damages relating to the Entry and/or your participation in Code Hack, including: (a) your inability to submit an Entry, or the disqualification of your Entry, (b) loss of use, data, business or profits, (c) disruption of or problems relating to telephone network connections, wifi, computer systems or servers, (d) loss of or damage to your personal equipment or possessions, (e) cancellation, suspension or alteration of the terms of Code Hack, (f) Island Health's use of the Entry in accordance with the License or (g) personal injury.

4 PRIVACY STATEMENT AND MEDIA CONSENT

4.1 Personal Information:

By your voluntary participation in Code Hack, you expressly consent to Island Health (directly or through its contracted service providers) collecting your personal information. Your personal information is collected for the purposes of registering you for Code Hack, administering and promoting Code Hack, and communicating with you about current and future Code Hacks and related events.
