

This document provides only a snapshot of distribution and collection and is an underestimate of total numbers. Harm reduction supplies are distributed as part of a provincial program to reduce bloodborne diseases.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Contracted service providers include counts for SOLID and AVI. Both organizations are contracted by Island Health to deliver harm reduction services in downtown Victoria. These numbers come from quarterly reporting to the STOP HIV/AIDS Program.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Various Island Health programs (MHSU & Public Health) distribute and collect needles; only counts for the Sobering Assessment Center on Pembroke St is captured in this document.
