

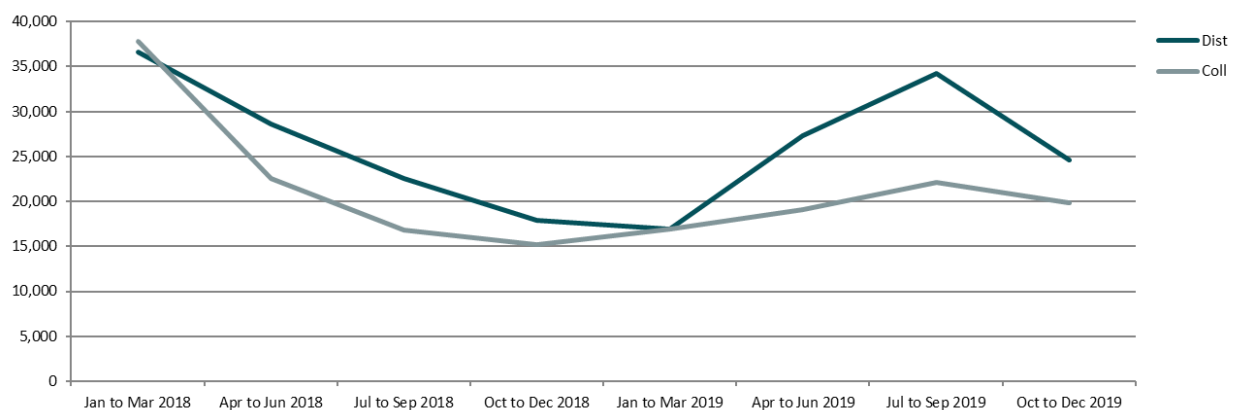

³ Needle collection and distribution is a shared responsibility of multiple agencies and programs. This document provides only a snapshot of distribution and collection and is an underestimate of total numbers. Harm reduction supplies are distributed as part of a provincial program to reduce bloodborne diseases.
