

Gastro-intestinal (GI) Infections and Outbreaks caused by Norovirus (NLI) or Other Pathogens STAFF Reporting Process and Return to Work Restrictions

GI 1 STAFF 23 Dec 2022

All potentially exposed staff will:

- Self monitor for symptoms
- Follow routine and enhanced Infection Prevention & Control precautions
 Prevention & Control precautions

Employee develops symptoms:

 New or sudden onset of Vomiting and/or Diarrhea (≥ 2 Episodes in 24rs) or 1 episode of both Vomiting and Diarrhea within 24 hours

Symptomatic Staff are to remain home or be sent home from work immediately

Employee remains symptom free

No work restrictions

If Outbreak declared follow staff reporting process:

- If symptoms begin at work staff will notify leader and the Provincial Workplace Health Call Centre (<u>PWHCC</u>)
- · Notify staffing office of absence
- Staff who become ill away from work and feel that it is a workplace-acquired illness, will notify the (<u>PWHCC</u>)

Staff Return to Work Restrictions:

Staff who develop symptoms consistent with a GI Infection (e.g. vomiting, diarrhea) while at home or in the community must remain off work until *at least* 48 hours after symptoms resolve, even if feeling better.

*Employees who work in multiple departments within one shift, should start work on a non-outbreak unit and finish their shift on the **Outbreak** unit.
