The fourth annual of Island Health's Code Hack event took place March 8-10 at the Royal Jubilee Hospital (RJH) in Victoria. The annual event brings together Island Health staff and medical staff with patients, students, industry experts, coders, builders, designers and others to collaborate a range of innovative solutions.

## Exposure & Participation:



We advertised the event online, with paid and organic content. Combined we received 370,000+ impressions across all posts and 2,400+ direct clicks to the Code Hack webpage, encouraging potential participants, mentors and volunteers to apply.

## How it works:

We created our own digital space for hackers to identify problems and opportunities within healthcare during the week leading up to the event. Participants were each invited to submit 1 problem in any of the 4 following categories:

Health Systems

Patients

Care Teams

Open Challenge

Participants were asked to vote up to three times for the problem they were most interested in working on, or saw as very important. At this event we hacked the top six problems as voted by the CodeHack community and an additional seven problems chosen by a Selection Committee.

## The Process:

13 people pitched their problems, and 13 teams were formed to solve each problem within 24 hours. These teams presented their solutions to a panel of judges, aiming to be one of four teams chosen for the finalist round of presentations. The judges awarded three winning teams with prize money and plaques, while the audience of participants voted for the People's Choice Award winner.

Open Challenge

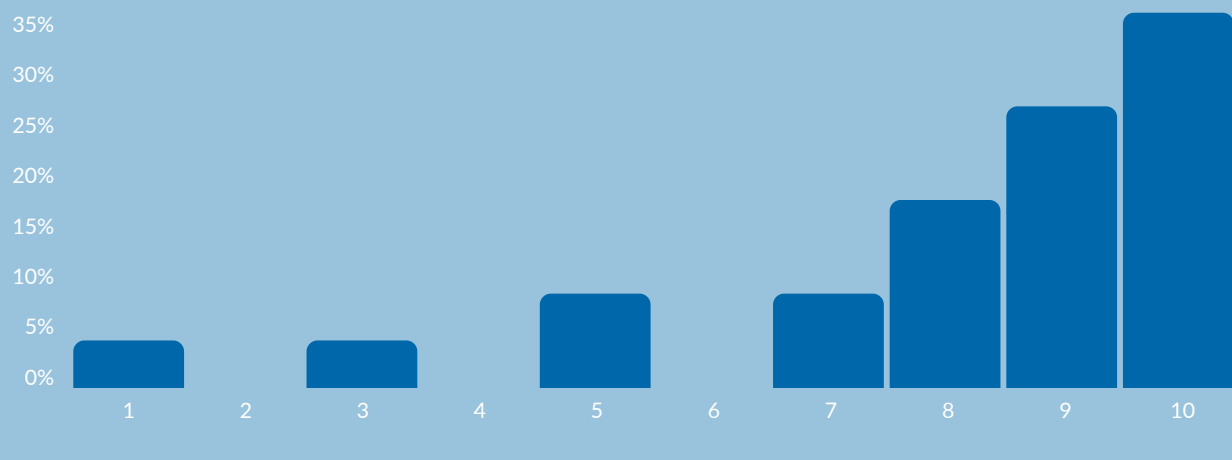
How might we combat loneliness on Vancouver Island by innovating solutions to enhance mental and physical health, and alleviate healthcare burdens?
