## Primary Care Provider Influenza Vaccine Letter

After two seasons of relatively low influenza activity, we expect incidence to increase this season. Your recommendation is one of the most important factors in the decision to get vaccinated. Please continue to stress the importance of influenza vaccination with patients at higher risk of harm, as well as those who are in contact with people at higher risk which includes healthcare providers.

This season, influenza vaccine will also be accessible through health authority clinics providing both COVID-19 and influenza vaccination, and 'whole community' clinics occurring through October and November in rural and remote areas. To ensure influenza vaccines are available in clinics, fewer doses are allocated to primary care providers. For this season, we recommend only ordering influenza vaccine for patients who have barriers to accessing vaccination clinics (eg. mobility issues, home visits).

The Provincial Influenza campaign starts in early October. Primary Care Providers can start placing orders the week of October 24th, with expected distribution the week of October 31<sup>st</sup>.

## Eligibility:

Influenza vaccine is recommended for everybody aged 6 months and older, and is publicly funded. We recommend strongly those who are at higher risk of influenza complications as well as those in contact with people at higher risk to get vaccinated this season. This includes:

- Children age 6 months to 2 years
- People 65 years of age and older
- Pregnant women
- People 5-64 years of age with underlying chronic health conditions
- Health care workers
- Visitors to health care facilities
- Essential community service providers

## Health Unit Ordering and Distribution Plan:

Public Health receives regular shipments of influenza vaccine from BCCDC from October through December. If you require vaccine for clients who are homebound or have difficulty accessing community clinics, please request only the quantity of vaccine you anticipate needing for the first two weeks. **Subsequent orders** can be placed if needed. Doses on hand **must** be recorded on the order form. **Forms with incomplete information including doses on hand will result in a delay in orders being filled, as Public Health will need to follow-up to request missing information.** Allow at least 3 working days (Monday to Friday) to fill your **order.** 

Please take all steps needed to minimize vaccine wastage.

Influenza vaccine will be distributed based on available supply. If an ordered vaccine is no longer available, another equivalent product will be supplied. If no influenza vaccine or acceptable substitute is available, you will be notified by the local health unit.
