Services Offered

- MHSU Intake screens and assesses referrals to determine the most appropriate mental health and/or substance use services to meet your needs. Call to self-refer or have a physician fax a referral form.
- Single Session Therapy is a same day, goal-oriented counselling session that offers therapeutic support. Call CARES to book.
- Indigenous Outreach Services offers support to those who self-identify as Indigenous and are seeking help for mental health and/or substance use concerns. Call to self-refer or have a physician fax a referral form.
- Enhanced Collaborative Care (ECC) provides a one-time psychiatric assessment for diagnostic clarification and treatment recommendations. *Physician referral required.
- Rapid Access Addiction Clinic (RAAC) offers support for opiate use concerns and provides opiate replacement treatment options. To reach RAAC call 250-519-3776
- Peer Support Workers provide navigation and support by people with lived MHSU experience. Call CARES to book.
